Superintendent's Report

It's been one of the most peculiar winters I have ever seen.

On February 28th, we had a daytime high of 10.3 degrees, an overnight forecast of -16 and a high of -7 for February 29th. That was to be followed by 8 days of mid to high single digits above 0. With El Nino expected to persist in the next couple of months, it may very well be an early spring for golf.

We closed out last fall by rebuilding the 10th and 11 th yellow tee decks, leveling them and enlarging them to accommodate the higher levels of traffic those tees are seeing, and to improve their playability. There is a bit remaining to do to them once the grass starts to grow but they should be back in play in relatively short order.

This spring we will also be leveling the #5 white and blue tee deck, and intend to add drainage to #15 and #16 in the coming fall.

We will be adding 12 new carts to the fleet this season and will have several from the older fleet for sale once the new ones arrive. We are also looking to add a new greens mower to our mowing equipment line up, to make sure the greens are the very best they can be.

In the upcoming year we will miss Bob Horton, a friend and loyal volunteer for many years, whose dedication and consistency we relied upon. We also grieve the loss of Jimmy Horton. That is a lot of loss for the Horton family in a short time. My heart and thoughts are with you.

So, we look forward to better days and times, changed, though they may be. With the weather forecast that I'm looking at for the upcoming month, it may soon be time to get the golf clubs out of storage and start polishing them up for the coming season.

I am looking forward to seeing you all out on the course this spring!
