Areas to be targeted for re-sodding and expanding would be 10 yellow, 11 yellow and 14 tees.

Cart Shed Project and Clubhouse Reconstruction

Unforeseen delays and complications have resulted in the cart shed project budget doubling. board unanimously endorsed rebuilding a single-story, ground-level structure with a larger footprint than the
