



TKT MEMORIAL MIXED - SUNDAY RULES SHEET

Rules of Golf: Golf Canada/Rules of Golf govern play except where modified by these Local Rules. Each player is responsible for knowing the rules.

FORMAT

Front 9 (Alternate-Shot): Both players tee off and choose the preferred tee shot. Partners then alternate shots until the ball is holed. Summer rules: do not lift, clean and place during alternate-shot. Do not replace your partner's ball with your own.

Back 9 (Scramble): Lift, clean and place within one scorecard length in the general area, no nearer the hole staying in the same conditions. Partners select the best shot after each stroke; both play from that spot until holed. A minimum of 3 tee shots from each player must be used during the scramble 9 holes.

Teeing Grounds:

- Players must play from the designated tournament tees - yellows for women and whites for men.
- Golfers 65 years of age and older have the option of playing up one tee; however, this excludes them from the championship but they are eligible for all other prizes.

Penalty Areas (Red Stakes/Lines): A player may ground the club in a penalty area provided the ball is not moved. If the ball is in a penalty area, the player may play it as it lies without penalty, or take Rule 17.1d relief with one penalty stroke: stroke-and-distance, back-on-the-line, or lateral relief for a red penalty area.

Drop Area - Hole #5: If taking relief from the penalty area on hole #5, the player may use the marked drop area with one penalty stroke.

Hole #7,15,16 Fence / Red Penalty Area: The fence located inside the red penalty area is an immovable obstruction, not out of bounds. If the ball lies outside the penalty area and the fence interferes with the lie, stance, or area of intended swing, free relief is available under Rule 16.1. Take the nearest point of complete relief and drop within one club-length, no nearer the hole, in the general area. If the ball lies in the penalty area, there is no free relief from the fence; play it as it lies or proceed under Rule 17 with one penalty stroke. No free relief for line of play only.

Fenced Areas: All fenced areas are extremely culturally sensitive. Please pay the respect that they are due. Balls are not to be retrieved from these areas and golfers must not enter these areas for any reason at any time.

Provisional/Second Ball: If in doubt whether a ball is in the penalty area on holes #7, #8, or #12, the Committee permits a provisional ball under the penalty-area relief options. If the original is found outside the penalty area, it must be played. If there is doubt about any other ruling or procedure, play two balls under Rule 20.1c(3) and report to the Committee before signing the scorecard.

Out of Bounds: White stakes right of hole #10 and left of hole #18 denote out of bounds. Stroke and distance applies.

Free Relief: Free relief is available from GUR marked with white paint, including the left side of the cart path on hole #6 fairway; newly planted trees surrounded by drainage pipe; piles of aerifying plugs used in repair; cart paths and roadways defined as graveled surfaces; wrong putting greens; and a ball embedded in its own pitch mark in the general area.

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Suspension of Play: One prolonged blast of the horn means play is suspended by the Committee.

Scoring:

- Each player is responsible for keeping an accurate scorecard.
- Exchange scorecards with another player in your group.
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Ties / Scorecard Playoff:

- First place: sudden-death playoff beginning with hole 18 and then following through 1 until a victor is determined.
- All other ties: scorecard playoff using gross-score retrogression - compare Sunday's score, back 9 (holes 10-18), then last 6 (13-18), last 3 (16-18), hole 18; if still tied, compare backwards hole-by-hole from hole 17 until broken.

Back 9 (Scramble): Lift, clean and place within one scorecard length in the general area, no nearer the hole staying in the same conditions. Teeing Grounds:

- Players must play from the designated tournament tees - yellows for women and whites for men.
- Golfers 65 years of age and older have the option of playing up one tee; however, this excludes them from the championship but they are eligible for all other prizes.

Penalty Areas (Red Stakes/Lines): A player may ground the club in a penalty area provided the ball is not moved. If the ball is in a penalty area, the player may play it as it lies without penalty, or take Rule 17.1d relief with one penalty stroke: stroke-and-distance, back-on-the-line, or lateral relief for a red penalty area.

Drop Area - Hole #5: If taking relief from the penalty area on hole #5, the player may use the marked drop area with one penalty stroke.

Hole #7,15,16 Fence / Red Penalty Area: The fence located inside the red penalty area is an immovable obstruction, not out of bounds. If the ball lies outside the penalty area and the fence interferes with the lie, stance, or area of intended swing, free relief is available under Rule 16.1. Take the nearest point of complete relief and drop within one club-length, no nearer the hole, in the general area. If the ball lies in the penalty area, there is no free relief from the fence; play it as it lies or proceed under Rule 17 with one penalty stroke. No free relief for line of play only.
